

- (1) The operation of summer schools shall be under the direction of the office of the superintendent.
- (2) Principals for summer school assignment shall be designated by the office of the superintendent.
- (3) Teaching positions in the summer schools shall ordinarily be filled by applicants from members of the district staff, provided however, that when the best educational interests of students so dictate, some appointments may be made from among those applicants from outside the district.
- (4) The salaries for teachers in the summer school shall be designated in accordance with the collective bargaining agreement.
- (5) Class hours for students shall be determined according to the nature of programs offered, upon the recommendation of the principal and the approval of the office of the superintendent.
- (6) High School Programs
 - (a) Students are permitted to earn one unit of credit in the districtís summer school program each year. Students may earn additional credit in approved programs at other accredited institutions. Courses offered be equal in expected standards of achievement and content to those offered during the regular school year. Courses shall be offered for enrichment, to improve basic skills, or to make up credit due to failure during the regular school year.
 - (b) Students are permitted to enroll with written permission from their Principal or counselor. Satisfactory completion of such courses shall be recorded on the transcript and such credits shall apply to requirements for high school graduation.
- (7) Summer school programs shall ordinarily begin one week after the end of the regular school year.
- (8) The summer school principal shall transmit credit earned by students to the respective schools.
