As an assistant principal for over ten years in New York City and Portland Public, Alicia has focused on partnering with staff and community to center the student learning experience through collaborative strategic planning for instruction, equity, multi-tiered systems of support, and enhanced school communication, climate, and culture.

Alicia began her career in the New York City Department of Education after a decade working in the NYC private sector. She was an elementary school teacher in Brooklyn for four years, followed by seven years in Manhattan at the 6-12th grade Institute for Collaborative Education (ICE). At ICE, she designed and taught science, technology, and arts courses and became assistant principal in 2009. Raised in the Pacific Northwest, she returned with her family in 2012.
