
Wilson provides a rigorous course of study and encourages high academic performance and intellectual growth, while providing opportunities for students who excel in the fine arts to develop their gifts.

Academics

- Advanced Placement/Advanced: More than 23 courses prepare students for AP exams or provide advanced curricula, including English, English Literature and Composition, Studio Art, Drawing, Spanish, Calculus, Statistics, World History, US History, Government and Politics, Micro/Macro Economics, Psychology, Biology, Physics, and Chemistry.
- Visual and Performing Arts: 47 Courses
- Freshman Communities allow small groups of students to move through core courses together (World History, Physics, English, Health, and College and Career Readiness), easing the transition to high school.
- Broad range of electives including Sound Engineering, Yoga/Mindful Studies, Digital Media and Graphic Design, Woods and Metals, Psychology, Computer Science, Photography, Math Modeling and Dynamic Systems, and advanced science offerings.

- Every year, Wilson students are chosen for the Apprenticeships in Science and Engineering Program (ASE).
- More than 60 clubs from Equestrian to Model United Nations, Mock Trial to Ultimate Frisbee, Anime to Chess, and Robotics to Earth Club.
- · A five-year Computer Science curriculum.
- 87 percent of Wilson graduates attend college. Graduates currently attend such colleges and universities as Portland Community College, Bowdoin, Brown, Carnegie Mellon, University of Chicago, Northwestern, Harvard, Yale, OSU, U of O, Stanford, Vassar, University of Washington and West Point.

- Career Technical Education: Students can also explore hands-on technical subjects in classes such as Sound Engineering, Video Production, Architectural Drawing, a five-year Computer Science curriculum and much more.
