What is a 9th Grade Academy?



Earning all of your credit in 9th grade makes it more likely that you will graduate on time. It's show time!!



What do I need to graduate?

- 24 credits
- In 9th grade CORE classes you must earn a C or higher. (English, History, Physics, & Math)
- Your College and Career or AVID Class will help you earn personalized learning graduation requirements. this. You need two CRLE's that may include a resume, college visit, or internship.

9th Grade Quarter Credits

In 9th grade you will earn .25 credit per quarter

- You will receive credit each quarter.
- There are 4 quarters each school year.
- By the end of the year you should have 1.0 credit per class to be on track for graduation.

Passing Grade = Credit

• To earn a passing grade you must earn an A, B, or C at the end of the quarter.





School Computer Account Login and Password

Every student is required to setup a complex password as they log in to a school computer. The password policies and requirements are the same as staff accounts.

Student Logins:

Example 1: John Smith, ID# 123456, username: jsmith3456

Last name up to 10 characters, if hyphenated last name, typically the first last name, but if not try the second last name, or even both last names put together up to ten characters see example 2.

Example 2: Jane Smith-Jackson, ID# 112233, username: jsmithjacks2233

Also the last four digits of the students' ID number.

Passwords:

- Must be at least 8 characters long,
- Must have a capital or special character
- Must have a number.

Students are encouraged to set up the challenge response questions that allow them to reset their own passwords at https://password.pps.net/.

GETTING STARTED WITH PARENTVUE AND STUDENTVUE

ParentVUE and StudentVUE are websites that offer secure, private access to school and student information, including assignments, grades, attendance, school calendar, and teacher contact details. In ParentVUE, you can see the information for all of your students.

► To create an account, you need the web address and activation key provided by the school district.

First Time Access: Create an Account

- 1. In your web browser, go to the address provided by the school district.
- 2. Click I am a parent or I am a student, as appropriate.



3. Click I have an activation key and need to create my account.



4. Read the Privacy Statement and click I Accept.



 Enter your name and activation key exactly as they appear in your letter from the school, and click Continue to Step 3.



 Choose a user name and password (at least 6 characters), provide an email address, and click Complete Account Activation.






