Topic 1 - Called to Order

The meeting was called to order at 5:35 pm by Co-Chair Sachin Wheatley.

Topic 2 - Adopt Meeting Minutes from 3/12/25

Sachin Whetley motioned to approve meeting minutes. Ayla Ercin seconded. All in favor (9), none opposed (0).

Topic 3 - Staff Update, Robyn Faraone, Director of Strategic Partnerships and Deborah Kafoury, Chief of Staff

There was discussion of decision-making criteria, PAC purpose, charter and clarifications of the roles of the PAC versus staff. Several proposals were reviewed, including: potential distribution formula by school, Learning Acceleration programs and principal feedback, and Educational Assistants.

Topic 4 - Committee Discussion

Committee members discussed which programs they were most interested in funding. Here's a summary of the statements by Committee members:

Suzanne Clark- Support 5th grade tutoring (Ignite), Support food pantries, and support \$100K-200K for seed money/fundraising. Support establishing a goal of fundraising for EA's in future.

Sachin Wheatley- Supports 5th grade (Ignite), IXL for 9th/10th grades, Food pantries, Seed money/fundraising.

Ayla Ercin- Supports Kindergarten EAs, maybe 5th grade tutoring (Ignite). Prefer educational focus, rather than food pantries.

David LaMadrid- Concerns that this process was biased with only a few options presented and a short timeline for decision-making. He would support Community Schools, food pantries and fundraising.

Daniel Levine- Staffing is top priority. EA's, even if it is a small number. Also supports Community Schools concept, but would want it to add staff.

Alisa Welch- Since she learned that they will lose 4 teachers at MLC, she is more focused on adding staff to school buildings. She does not think donors will support technology/app, but 5th grade tutoring (Ignite) is a possibility. Support High Impact Tutors and EAs in school buildings.

Annika Houghton- Supports EA's, 5th grade tutoring (Ignite) and IXL for 9th and 10th grade if it's done in the classroom rather than homework.

Audrey Gnich- Support High impact tutoring expanded in schools, one-on-one tutoring options and increasing counseling hours.

Trina Huff- Support IXL for 9th and 10th graders, adding EA's or splitting the funding among schools.

Topic 5 - Vote on Proposals

Chair Trina Huff help a vote to see how many supported each component. This voting was just a hand raise for each component separately. Three of the committee representatives did not raise their hand for any of the components in this initial voting round. Food Pantries: 1, 5th Grade Tutoring (Ignite): 3, seed funding for future fundraising: 3, IXL for 9th & 10th grades: 3, EA's: 4, Split between schools: 2, Counselors: 2, High Impact Tutors: 4.

Staff will find out how many High Impact Tutors could be added with the funding, and will put together a google survey with options for the committee to vote on by end of day, Monday, March 24, 2025. We will continue the discussion and voting at a PAC meeting on Wednesday, March 26, 2025 but given that it is spring break some representatives may be traveling and unavailable to attend.
