

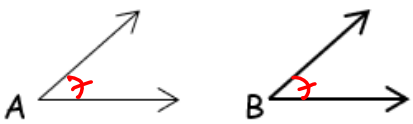
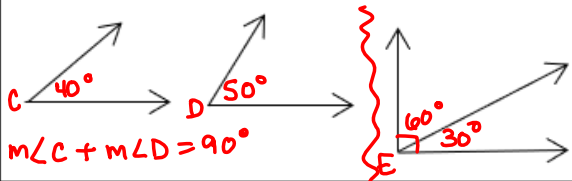
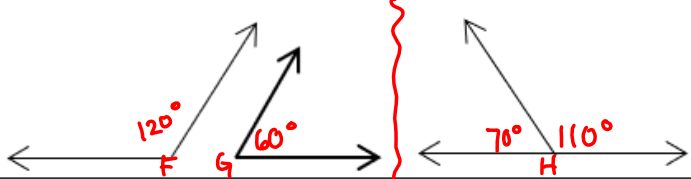
Definition	Example	Naming
<p>Angle - <u>2 rays</u> with a common endpoint.</p> <p>Can also be created by <u>the intersection</u> of lines or segments</p>		<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • just the vertex if it is the ONLY angle with that vertex <p>OR</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • three letters side - vertex - side

Types of Angles - Classified by measure

Acute	Right	Obtuse	Straight
less than 90°	exactly 90°	between 90° and 180°	exactly 180°

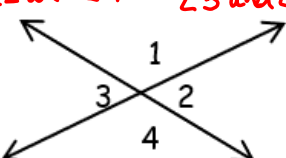
Key markings

<p>Parallel Will never cross</p>	<p>Perpendicular</p>	<p>Congruent</p>
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Notes	
Congruent Angles Angles with the same <u>measure</u> .	 $\angle A \cong \angle B$
Complementary Angles Two angles whose measures add up to <u>90°</u> .	 $m\angle C + m\angle D = 90^\circ$
Supplementary Angles Two angles whose measures add up to <u>180°</u> .

Angle Pair relationships <u>one intersection</u>		
Definition	Example	Properties
Linear Pair Two <u>adjacent</u> angles that make a straight angle. Share a Side	 $\angle 1$ and $\angle 3$ $\angle 2$ and $\angle 4$	supplementary
Vertical Angles Two <u>non-adjacent</u> angles formed by two intersecting lines.	$\angle 1$ and $\angle 4$ $\angle 2$ and $\angle 3$	congruent
