RE: Student Teaching Leave Applications for the 2021/2022 fall semester for all PFSP Unit Members

Applications for PFSP Student Teaching leaves of absence for the fall semester of the 2021/2022 school year may now be submitted for consideration. Approved fall Student Teaching Leaves may be effective August 2021 through January 2022. Completed forms are due by **Monday, February 8, 2021.**

Student Teaching Leave application forms are available online at <https://www.pps.net/Page/1710> under the PFSP Student Teaching link. Up to five (5) PFSP Student Teaching Leaves, which shall include up to three (3) months of District-paid insurance for employees already enrolled in the SD #1 Health & Welfare Trust, shall be granted yearly.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS AND PROCEDURES FOR APPLICATION:

- Student Teaching Leave application submissions must include:
 - **Proof of program enrollment.** To be eligible, Student Teaching must be completed with a Portland Public School only and not another district.
 - A **current health form** completed and signed by a licensed physician attesting to the unit member's satisfactory health.
 - Candidates must consult with their principal or immediate supervisor, whose signature is required on the application form.

A confirmation email of receipt will be sent to the applicant when their application has been received. A notice of approval or denial will be emailed to the applicant after the PFSP Student Teaching Leave Committee has reviewed the applications.

- Applicants must have been employed by Portland Public Schools for at least two (2) years prior to the request for a PFSP Student Teaching Leave.
- A Student Teaching Leave is not considered a break in consecutive service for the purpose of calculating salary placement, seniority, or retirement credit.
