As educators, we know that this is not what is best for our students.

We understand that we have significant disagreements on critical issues. We can only bridge these and reach agreement through dialogue, cooperation, and compromise at the table, not on the sidewalk.

We have heard from Governor Kotek, the Portland Metro Chamber of Commerce, and countless families who are urging us to come to a resolution and avoid school closures. We appreciate the impact of your hard work and dedication to the school system, and we hope to find common ground to reach an agreement that will honor our educators and benefit our students and the community at large.

Let's work together to keep schools open.
