COMMONLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What do students learn and do at the Student Success Center?

Students learn skills in the following areas: Emotional Regulation, Conflict Resolution, and Healthy Choices. Mental health and drug & alcohol assessment and referrals are offered. Students leave SSC with a Re-engagement Plan to support student success when they return to school.

How long is the Program?

Students attend the SSC program for 3 weeks, Monday through Friday from 8:30am-12:30pm. Student support continues for a semester or more.

When do students report to the Student Success Center (SSC)?

You will be contacted for an intake interview before starting. After the intake, your SSC counselor will let you know when you start. Generally, new students start every Monday morning at 8:30am.

Are food and transportation provided?

A small morning breakfast is provided for all students. Lunch is not served. Students that do not have bus passes will be given bus tickets daily. Parents/guardians may also transport their child.

What about my student's academics?

Students are allowed to attend their afternoon classes at their home school (unless an alternative academic plan is noted in their hearings letter). Students are responsible to keep up with their homework from their morning classes. If the student is not allowed back on campus, homework will be collected by school and given to parents or guardians. High school students can also earn 0.5 Health or Elective credit if they successfully complete the program.

What about Special Education Students?

If your student is on an IEP, sending school will allow students back for their afternoon classes to meet their IEP goals.

What about ELL?

SSC works with PPS Translation and Interpretation Services to provide culturally appropriate services as needed to ELL students and their families.
