General Course Description: This is an introductory class for students who want to learn different video-making skills and who want to pursue video production as a professional career. We will explore the art of storytelling using filmmaking tools that are available to students during distance learning. Some of these may be storyboarding, cinematography, video editing, acting, directing, and sound design. Collaboration is a key to the success of a film as well as student engagement.

Course Content and Schedule: Synchronous (In class work): Work that is assigned during Zoom meetings. Students will either reflect on a short film being shown or will follow a prompt. It is important for students to attend class and arrive at meetings on time. Asynchronous (Projects): This is work that you will complete outside of synchronous meetings.		



Pre-Production Assignments Completed - Each project in class comes with a plan. Usually this plan involves paperwork. This can be a script, shot list, storyboard, production schedule, etc. These assignments need to be turned in on the deadline.

Professionalism During Production: Attending production meetings, making pre production and project deadlines as well as hitting scheduling goals. The **Franklin STRONG** mantra is built into each rubric and is expected to be followed.

Your Proficiency shown in the Final Video - This is a project based class which means that we learn by doing.
