### General Course Description:

This class is for students who want to learn the different skills required in the making of films and who want to pursue the role of directing as a professional career. Students will explore the filmmaking process through Story, Pre-Production, Production, Post-Production, and Premiering. As the capstone for Franklin High School's Video Production department students will complete one film this semester This film will be premiered at the end of the semester. The community will be invited to watch student work. Projects will be highly dependent on students' abilities in leadership, professionalism, and project management; success will depend on daily engagement.

Course Content and Schedule:

**Synchronous (In class work):** This time will be used to assign, screen and critique work. We will also be viewing films to inspire, connect, and reflect on. It is important for students to attend class and arrive to meetings on time.

**Asynchronous (Your film):** It is during this time that students will complete most of their work. This includes:

- 1. Pre-Production
- 2. **Production:** Attending production meetings (i.e. pitch meetings, pre-production meetings, footage reviews, and feedback sessions.), making pre production and project deadlines as well as hitting scheduling goals.
- 3. Your Proficiency shown in the Final Film The rubric will include a Story proficiency grade as well as a **Tech** Proficiency grade. Communication is invaluable! If at any point you are struggling with a certain element of your project please communicate with me about it so we can help you achieve your goals.

There is limited technology training in this class. If you are unsure of how to use a piece of equipment please ask us your specific questions otherwise you are Breaking It!
