

Video Production 1-2

Beginning Video Production

Course Description:

This is an introductory class for students who want to learn different video-making skills and who want to pursue video production as a professional career. We will explore the art of storytelling using tools that are essential to making a film. Some of these are storyboarding, cinematography, video editing, acting, directing, and sound design. Projects will be highly dependent on group work; success will depend on daily engagement.

Grading - Grading is divided up by journal and project completion.

In Class Work makeup 25% of your grade. They are assigned at the start of class. Students will either reflect on a short film being shown or will follow a prompt. **It is important for students to attend class and arrive on time.**

Projects are graded on:

Pre-Production Assignments Completed - Each project in class comes with a plan. Usually this plan involves paperwork. This can be a script, shot list, storyboard, production schedule, etc. These assignments need to be turned in on the deadline.

Professionalism During Production: We have been given the privilege to shoot our projects in the halls and on our school grounds. With this privilege we must always be **Franklin Strong**. This means being Thoughtful, Respectful, Organized, Neighborly and Generous while on set.

Your Proficiency shown in the Final Video - This is a project based class which means that we learn by doing. Each project will have an attached rubric which will show you the criteria given in order to be successful. Communication is invaluable! If at any point you are struggling with a certain element of your project please communicate with me about it so we can help you achieve your goals.

Classroom Behavior and Policies:

Absences and Tardies: Per the FHS Student Handbook, missing over 20 minutes of class results in an Absence. This includes extended pass use. Please aim to be on time and in class, ready to engage. Communicate with me or another adult you trust if you are having difficulty making it to class or staying in class. During production time if you go missing from your group this will result in an absence. If you are not with your group then you are not in class.

Language: The use of racist, sexist, homophobic, or other derogatory remarks will not be tolerated in this class.

S-222 and S-220

S-222 Computer Lab Is only available for projects assigned in **Video Production**. The Editing Lab is a **sacred** place and will be treated as such.

Lab Hours: Students can schedule a time to edit projects outside of class time. The editing lab is available during lunch or and can be made available after school.

Production Space S-220: Students will report to this room whenever their class is in production on a project. Safety and respect is our number one concern in this room. Students will practice safety at all times - no horseplay, running, physical interactions of any sort. Students will respect their peers and equipment. We all share the same resources - please be mindful of our shared spaces.
