Course Description:

Projects will be highly dependent on group work and assignments completed **outside of class**; success will depend on daily engagement. The yearbook only reflects the effort given to it by the students. Mr. Souza does not participate in the duties of yearbook class.

During production time if you go missing from your group this will result in an absence. If you are not with your group then you are not in class.
