Psychology Syllabus

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Description: This is a year-long survey course introducing students to the fascinating world of Psychology. We will have a textbook, but will also take notes, do simulations and experiments, write essays, hold classroom discussions, peer teach, watch films, and create a variety of projects.

Textbook: Thinking about Psychology: The Science of Mind and Behavior, 3rd Edition.

Preparation outside of class will be necessary in the form of reading and completing other assignments and projects; however, there will be some class time allocated for these assignments, too.

Assessments: There will be chapter tests/quizzes, essays, presentations, and other non-traditional assessments like creating hands-on projects.

Learning Targets: The students will understand and make connections among topics that may include but are not limited to: History of Psychology, The brain, Memory and Learning, Developmental Psychology, Social Psychology, Sensation and Perception, Consciousness, Clinical/Abnormal Psychology.
