College and Career Exploration (CCE), Course Outline 2019-20

Course Description: This class is an opportunity for 9th grade students to gain exposure to the working world they will one day enter and the ways that post-secondary options, including college, will help them in the future. The intention is to "connect the dots" between school and career in ways that keep students motivated to continue to explore career interest throughout high school and to graduate with the skills they will need for the future. After having chances to reflect on their current strengths and interests, students in this course will gain exposure to a wide range of possible careers, the basics of personal finance, the value of community service, and the expectations for college entrance and scholarships. Students will learn and utilize a variety of digital communication tools, including the creation of a digital portfolio. By the end of the course, students will have opportunities for meaningful exploration that will create excitement around college and career, and give students a clear pathway to their future possibilities.

Materials: students need a class spiral that they can use in this class. It will also be used in their English 1-2 class. Students will also be expected to read 1 book of their choice per quarter.
