Differentiation/accessibility strategies and supports (TAG, ELL, SpEd, other):

All assignments can be scaffolded up or down according to a students needs. ELL and SpEd students will be assisted through coordination with their ELL or SpED teacher. Students will be given alternate ways to complete assignments as needed.

Students are encouraged to use their camera because it is an important aspect of the art form. Use of a camera is optional though. Students will use the Chat feature to ask the teacher questions or to respond to questions. Any images displayed through Zoom are expected to be school appropriate.

Evidence of Course Completion

Assessment of Progress and Achievement: All assignments will be given to students through the Canvas learning program. Each assignment will be given a point value. The value is based on the estimated time it will take to complete the assignment. Assignments will be graded on Canvas and then transfer to Synergy.

Progress Reports/Report Cards (what a grade means):

All assignments will be given a Point Value. The Point Value for each assignment is determined by the estimated amount of time it will take to complete the assignment. For example the weekly discussion question is worth 10 pts and a weekly project based assignment is worth 25 to 50 pts.

Each student's grade is determined by the percentage of points a student earns by completing the assignments for the semester.

Earning 100% to 90% of points available is an - A

Earning 79% to 70% of points available is an - C

Earning 69% to 60% of points available is an - D

Earning 59% to 0% of points available is an - F
