RICHMOND FOUNDATION リッチモンドファンデーション

The Richmond School Foundation (RSF) raises money solely for staff positions. Our goal is to raise \$60,000 this spring to maintain our four-classroom model. It may sound like a lot, but if we can raise \$100 for every student, we'll exceed our goal. That's less than \$10/month per student!

3RD QUARTER REPORT CARDS/PROGRESS REPORTS

We just wanted to remind families that as part of the terms with Portland Association of Teachers (PAT) to turn a planning day into an instructional day to make up for school closures this winter, the district agreed that third quarter report cards/progress reports will only be mandatory for students that meet the following criteria:

- Seniors
- Students who otherwise need a grade (i.e. eligibility for athletics or college applications)
- Students in quarter classes
- Students in danger of failing or whose behavior or achievement shows a significant decline
- Students receiving special education services

Please know that at any time you can communicate directly with your child's teacher to discuss your child's progress and understand how your child is performing in school.

Also know that end of year report cards/progress reports will be delivered to all families upon completion of the school year in accordance with the regular schedule.

MT. TABOR JAPANESE RESEARCH RESIDENCY

This year, the District convened a group of Mt. Tabor parents, teachers, and administrators to look more critically at one experience that has been a part of Mt. Tabor culture for twenty years: the Japanese Research Residency (JRR). Students in the Japanese Immersion Program at Mt. Tabor participate in a 14 day Research Residency experience every spring, paying their own way to travel to Japan (with some outside financial support available through Oya No Kai based on need). This year, nearly 80 Mt. Tabor Japanese Immersion students are participating in the Japanese Research Residency from April 14-May 1.


AFTER SCHOOL SURVEY RESULTS


A recent survey was created by the Richmond administration to gain a clearer understanding of parents' needs and desires for after school programming. Parents were asked to select the top three kinds of activities that they would like to see available for their child in an after school program. Of the 145 responses, the top three types of activities chosen involved science, art, and music. Parents were also asked why their child may not currently participate in an after school program. Of the 87 responses, the majority of parents checked 'full' as the reason to why they had not enrolled their child in an after school program. A smaller percentage of families rated too expensive, not offered, and time conflict as other

reasons why their child did not participate in an after school program. Families who checked 'other' as a response indicated that they were not aware of the programs being offered, attended after school programs at other locations, they were already paying for child care and did not want to pay for another program, or were lacking transportation.

Of the 64 individuals who provided comments when asked, "What suggestions do you and your child have for improving the programming that is currently offered?" one of the main themes that parents expressed was the need for more child care. Art 4 Life, the current on-site child care provider, has a wait list and there are competing expenses for families when paying for child care while also wanting their son or daughter to participate an after school activity.

While the Richmond administration will continue to explore opportunities to expand after-care options, the Richmond PTA is in the process





of planning to combine the end-of-summer ice cream social with an after-school activity fair. This will give parents an opportunity to connect with after school activity providers prior to the beginning of the school year.

FIXING OUR STREETS

Through the Portland Bureau of Transportation's **Fixing Our Streets** program, Safe Routes to School (SRTS) is expecting to make a large investment in safety improvements around Portland schools in the next few years. The Franklin Cluster has \$899,000 to spend on transportation safety improvements.

This spring we are asking families to help us figure out what is needed most. We have left a map of Richmond School outside of the office. We are asking families to use a highlighter to draw their walking or biking route from home to school and circling any safety concerns. Please write your concerns on a sticky note and attach to the bottom of the map (please include the intersection on the note). We are also asking you to place a mark of where you enter the school on the aerial view of the school. Instructions are also on the map.

PPS BUDGET: WE WANT TO HEAR FROM YOU

Budget overview

We want to hear from you about the 2017-18 budget for PPS! The Portland School Board has scheduled three listening sessions to take your comments on how we should allocate our dollars in the coming year.

Interim Superintendent Robert McKean presented his proposed budget to the Board on April 4. The budget is based on the assumption that the state will not provide enough funding for K-12 schools to cover our current level of services, so cuts are necessary. Under the superintendent's proposal, central administration would take a higher share of cuts, with some of that money redirected into critical school programs, such as literacy, curriculum and health and safety. But cuts to schools also are part of the proposed budget.

More details can be found in the Powerpoint presented to the Board, or in the full budget.

The Board will hold a budget work session May 23, with final adoption expected in June.
