There it is in your inbox...again! You're sure your student returned those books. Or never checked them out. And the notices still keep coming. Here are some tips to deal with overdue book email notices.

There are no overdue fines at Richmond.

If a book truly is lost, you can pay for it on School Pay, or purchase a copy of the book that was lost and donate it to the library.

Books are checked out by Chris Gustafson, the Teacher Librarian, Michelle George, our Library Assistant, or Chris's husband Wayne Gustafson, who is a regular library volunteer. None of us are perfect people and we operate equipment that is occasionally wacky. We may have made a checking out or checking in mistake.



If you tell us your student never checked a particular book out, we believe you.

Since the notices are auto-generated, it does no good to reply to them. Chris is always happy to respond to your emails and you can reach her at cgustafson@pps.net


THE BOOK FAIR IS COMING!

Hello everyone!

Looking for academic support in English after parent-teacher conferences? I found a great new resource called Tutor Doctor, a service that I think could be very helpful. They tutor all ages in all subjects, as well as Study Skills. You call and consult about your child and their needs, and they match you with one of their 120 experienced, personally interviewed and vetted, background-checked, tutors in the Portland area. You purchase hours of tutoring, and then your tutor comes to your house and works with your child according to your schedule. I am teaching Counseling Lessons for grades 1-4 this year on an every other week schedule. 3rd and 4th graders are working on Mindfulness and Growth Mindset Interactive Notebooks, which are an amazing tool for learning, and every child will then come home with their own personalized notebook to use in the future. 1st and 2nd graders have been working on the Zones of Regulation, learning how to identify their feelings, and how to get back into the "Green Zone".
