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PLAYGROUND UPDATE

The Richmond playground committee met this week with Wildwood Playgrounds to work towards finalizing our design. The vision is to have a playground will not only represent the Japanese Magnet Program, but will also be physically and creatively challenging for our students and the greater community at large. Our goal is to have the first phase installed for the 2006-2007 school year. The North area where the "volcano" had previously been will have a large physically challenging playstructure as well as a Japanese style castle. The Southern area will have 2 new play structures as well as balance and climbing elements. One of the play structures will be heavy on imaginative play. The playground designer will make a computer generated 3-D illustration that will be displayed in the office.

We should have a specific cost amount within the week

and can then start the work of grant writing. The plan for the playground is to do the fundraising through grants and corporate gifts. All funds from www.schoolpop.com will also be directed towards the playground as well. Because the cost of installing a new playground is likely to cost approximately \$90,000, it will most likely be installed in 2-3 phases.



JURIED ASSESSMENT FOR STATE TESTS

The State's juried assessment process is available to students who have mastered state content, but who have been unable to demonstrate that mastery on statewide assessment tests. For a juried assessment, the student submits a portfolio of work that is reviewed by a panel of judges to decide if the materials demonstrate the student's ability to meet state standards. Juried assessments are available for students in grades 3 through 8, plus the CIM (high school) level. A new option for juried assessments allows a district to submit student work in a language other than English. Parents who are interested in getting more information about the juried assessment option should contact the principal of their child's school. An Intent to Submit a Juried Assessment form is due to the OR Department of Education in mid-April, so if this is something you want to consider, please contact Kathryn Anderson as soon as possible.
