Our Media Asst., Lynne Cummings, is organizing the Richmond Foundation Talent Show. The show will take place on Friday, February 17, 2006.


Proceeds from the show benefit staffing our specials positions: P.E., Library, and Resource Teachers.

CELEBRATE PORTLAND PUBLIC SCHOOLS!

The third annual "Celebrate! Portland Public Schools" provides tools and information for parents to choose a school, entertainment and activities for kids, free parking, transportation and translation services.

What: A presentation by PPS and our community partners showcasing the wide range of exceptional educational options offered across the city: from neighborhood schools to special programs and focus option schools. The evening will feature information for parents from more than 92 schools and dozens of community partners, art projects and performances by more than 1200 PPS students, and a "get-acquainted with Kindergarten" room. The entire event is free to the public-childcare and language translation services will be available as well as free parking and transportation.

Who: Celebration is a partnership with the Portland Schools Foundation, PTA, and Community and Parents for Public Schools (CPPS). The event's costs are funded from the Voluntary Public Schools Choice Grant, a federal grant specifically reserved for promoting school choice. The purpose of the Celebration is to promote equity among schools, stimulate community partnerships, and celebrate the advantages and choices offered by Portland Public Schools. Resource booths in the exhibit hall will showcase the support services for schools provided by community partners and central administration. In 2005, more than 14,000 people attended the Celebration and this year's Celebration should prove to be an even bigger event.
