Letter from the Interim Principal

Dear Richmond Families,

In the next few weeks, look for big banners and charts with drafts of Richmond's vision and mission statements on display in the main hallway for your review and feedback. On Tuesday, November 1st, staff and leaders from Foundation, Oya No Kai, PTA, and Site Council will spend the day together with a strategic planning expert to work out the rough drafts of these important statements. We will use feedback from parent surveys completed after Backto-School Night to inform our work. Our goal is to have a viable rough draft of a vision statement that clearly captures the long-range plan for Richmond and the Japanese Immersion Program, as well as a mission statement that communicates what

Richmond and the JMP are all about. Here's how you can get involved in this work:

- Give us your feedback about our draft mission and vision statements. Less than 10% of Richmond families responded to the short survey from Back-to-School Night (it was also available in in the main hallway and sent out on the Oya No Kai list serve).
- Get involved in a committee about strategic planning work: school expansion, curriculum and instruction, school beautification, etc. Details in next week's newsletter.

Alert Regarding Dogs on the Playground

We have had a number of problems in recent weeks with dog owners allowing their dogs to run freely on the school grounds during school hours. The City and school district

require all dogs to be leashed during the hours the school is open for business. Richmond serves students from 6:00 AM—6:00 PM for childcare and instruction, therefore, all dogs must be leashed when on school property during those hours. New signs have been ordered for the fences to remind dog owners and playground users.

Several folks have been less than compliant when staff have stopped to politely ask that they leash their dog. If you see a dog running loose on school property, please do the following:

Never confront the owner if you are with children.
 We don't want you to risk injury to your child in order
 to ask for compliance.

- 2. Alert the school office about the location of dog and description of the owner. Office staff will talk to the dog owner or contact our local police officer for assistance if the situation is a repeat offense.
- 3. Model good dog behavior yourself if you routinely have a family dog with you when you drop off or pick up your child.

Richmond Foundation Update

Richmond School families raised \$645 last Tuesday by eating pizza at Pizzicato. Thanks to all of you who participated! Numbers are not complete, but after slightly more than a month of fundraising, the Richmond School Foundation has raised at least \$9,205. Last year, Richmond's Foundation raised \$3,910 during the entire year, so we're off to a good start!

Foundation's next event is at Barnes and Noble at Lloyd Center on Saturday, November 19 from 11:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. We need your family's help in many ways to make this fundraiser a success!
