## **Richmond Foundation Parent Pledge Drive Update**

**THIS WEEK:** 23 additional families gave money for a total of more than \$5,000.

- TOTAL PARTICIPATION AS OF 5-7-07: 92 out of 261 families for 35%!
- TOTAL AMOUNT AS OF 5-7-07: \$45,024.50 which is more than 2/3rds of the way to our goal of \$60,000.

**PAT YOURSELVES ON THE BACK:** Two years ago, 10% of families donated to the Parent Pledge Drive. Last school year, 20% donated, and this year, already 35% have donated.
