

Additional Transfer News

Portland Public Schools has just released several updates for the 2008-09 transfer proc-

- Current families with children enrolled in Richmond's pre-school program do not need to apply for a transfer if their child(ren) are going to be moving into kindergarten in 2008-09. Richmond pre-school children automatically advance to kindergarten, just as children automatically advance to the next grade from kindergarten through grade 12 in the Japanese Immersion Program.
- Richmond 5th grade students do <u>not</u> need to apply for a transfer to the Mt. Tabor Middle School Japanese Immersion Program. Richmond 5th graders automatically advance to the 6th grade JMP classes at Mt. Tabor, just as they've automatically moved from grade to grade at Richmond. This is true whether your family lives in the Mt. Tabor neighborhood or elsewhere in Portland Public Schools.

Track the Transfer Numbers!

Thank you for all your help promoting Richmond's Japanese Immersion Program to your friends, family, neighbors and co-workers! Your advocacy for our school has truly made all the difference this year.

The numbers below reflect a big increase in the rate of applications for the first week of the transfer process and we have 28 days to go until the deadline for transfer applications arrives on March 7th. The Rosetta Stone Comes to Richmond!

We've asked Portland Public Schools' department of English Language Learning to set Richmond up with an enterprise license for the English and Japanese versions of Rosetta Stone. This means that all of our students, staff and families will have web-based access to the Rosetta Stone language system to enable us to improve our English and/or Japanese language skills from anyplace we have internet access. Our student and staff data is being loaded this weekend so our school will be able to access Rosetta Stone by next week. Next week's *Richmond Shinbun* will include instructions to show how students, their families and our staff will be able to log in and start learning.



How will Rosetta Stone help our students with their English or Japanese fluency? Rosetta Stone will never replace a great teacher, but it can provide extra tutoring and reinforcement of language

skills that have been taught in the classroom. At school, the program will give classroom teachers the flexibility to concentrate on the personal instruction and interactive classroom activities that promote fluency while allowing some students to work independently on the computer to stretch their skills of listening, speaking, reading and writing in Japanese or English. Many parents have asked for additional resources to help support language learning at home. We hope the Rosetta Stone program gives you the flexibility and high-quality language support you've been asking for.

School Budget Update from Kathryn Anderson, Richmond principal

Recently, I let our teachers know the balance in our annual school consolidated budget has become much too low for this time of the school year. This fund of \$33,000 must cover all school expenses beyond basic salary and school cleaning costs and I told them I was concerned about high spending levels in several key areas that we control as a faculty:

- **Copy machine use**—over budget by more than 20% for this time of the school year. Teachers have been encouraged to plan ahead and use the District print shop for large print jobs, such as weekly homework, because printing by the District print shop is not charged to our school budget. The turnaround time for items submitted electronically is 2-3 days—just perfect for homework packets or large projects.
- **Supplies**, particularly for items or from funds parents provided during the first weeks of the school year. We have more than enough classroom and school supplies to last the school year and enable every teacher to fully implement all classroom projects and activities. In addition, I've asked teachers to make use of our shopping privileges at SchoolHouse Supplies, the free supply store to Portland teachers, when they need special materials for a project or activity.

While teachers have been asked to pull together as a team and make sensible choices when it comes to copying and supply use, parents and students should not notice a difference. The solutions to our budget crunch are close at hand. For example, I have used classroom funds to cover supply purchases by classrooms that collected money from parents in September for this purpose. Originally, these supply purchases had been charged to our school budget when they should have been deducted from the class fund that was credited with the parent contributions in the first place. Teachers also know field trip expenditures for class trips that have been *planned, approved and announced* will be covered.

Please do not hesitate to let me know if you have questions about our budget or have ideas about other resources we should investigate. Our budget records are always open to public review, so let Patsy know if you'd like to take a look.


Additional News from Richmond's Foundation



THE DIRT! The Richmond Garden Committee Update

Winter is always planning time for gardens. And that is exactly what we are up to on the Garden Committee right now. Since the beginning of December we have grown in numbers from a Committee of three parents and two teachers to eleven parents and two teachers! To accommodate and focus all our energy and enthusiasm for a garden at our school we have been working on committee structure and process.

Here are the ways to get the dirt on all the planning for and happenings in the garden. First, keep abreast of what is posted on the Garden News bulletin board in the cafeteria. Second, look to articles in the Shinbun for important dates and updates. We may also send out information via the Oya no Kai class listserves.

Through a generous grant from the Lucky Seven Foundation, the Garden Committee now has a budget of \$5,000. This seed money will enable us to move forward with our South Garden plans.

Ground breaking for the Southern Learning Lab Garden is scheduled for April 5th. We have a great preliminary working design which we will release for your perusal both on- lline and on the Garden News bulletin board in the Richmond cafeteria. We are scheduling an opportunity for discussion with teachers, parents and community members via 2 design meetings. They will be held Wednesday, February 20th at 2:30 in room 206 the second will be on Thursday, February 21st at 6:30 in the library. We want your input, enthusiasm and questions and will keep you posted!

We have a work party scheduled for Saturday, February 23rd from 10-2 for the North Garden. The plan is to mend the fence, empty and repair the compost bins, add some more compost mix to the beds and get ready for early spring planting. A more detailed list of projects for this day will be forth coming. Please come and bring your family.



If you want to know more and get involved there are many ways to do so. We are developing a garden work party corps – a list of folks who love to garden or love the idea of gardening and would be willing to be called upon to "dig in" (no special knowledge required!). We also need volunteers willing to be part of our garden subcommittees: particularly fund-raising, garden/work party and outreach – this does not necessarily mean coming to a lot of meetings.
