Buy Coffee in compostable bags to Support Richmond's Elm Trees

Richmond school's 20 American Dutch Elm trees need to be inoculated every 3 years to resist Dutch Elm Disease which can kill the beautiful trees which shade our school grounds. During inoculations in June of 2007, we used 800 microinjections of a fungicide recommended by foresters to protect our trees. The cost per injection was \$3.50 for a total of \$2800. For the next round of inoculations in 2010, prices and shipping costs are expected to be slightly higher.

To raise money for the inoculations, Save Our Elms, a 501c(3) non-profit, partners with Portland Roasting to sell delicious, freshly roasted coffee to the Richmond community. \$4.60 from every bag of regular coffee sold allows us to buy approximately 1.31 microinjectors. (Save Our Elms gets \$5.05 from every bag of decaf coffee, too!) The coffee is delicious, environmentally friendly and costs **\$10/pound for regular and \$11/pound for decaf**.

If you haven't tried the coffee yet, ground regular coffee is available for purchase in the office. The price is \$10 /pound (checks made to [Save Our Elms](#), please.) You can look in the coffee basket on Patsy's counter for the variety you like and either give your money to Patsy or place it in the box marked "Save Our Elms" on the office front wall. I place orders every Thursday morning at 8 AM for whole bean, decaf, and additional ground coffee. For an order, please fill out an order form (some are usually available on the table in front of the office or on Richmond's website) indicating your coffee choice and whole bean or ground preference and attach payment. (Please note decaf coffee costs \$11.00 a pound.) Coffee from orders will be available in the office by the next afternoon and it will be held in Patsy's coffee drawer just for you. Patsy can retrieve this for you; she is a great supporter of this program. We accept donations as well.

Portland Roasting descriptions:

All coffees for Richmond are our Farm Friendly™ Direct coffees because as important to us as the quality of our coffee is our social responsibility. We strongly believe that we can make a positive difference in the coffee world through direct, socially responsible coffee sourcing. We pay growers a premium for their coffee with 100% of the premium going to farm and community projects. All of these projects are designed to give back directly to the farmers - furthering the long term sustainable infrastructure.

Ethiopian – Kochere: This coffee is part of Project H.O.P.E., which stands for Hope and Opportunity for the People of Ethiopia. We are helping build a much needed community center for the Ethiopian farming community of Kochere to provide a common meeting place for educational purposes, as well as a vital medical dispensary for the people of Kochere.

French Organic – Certified organic; dark roast

Tanager's Song – an organic blend (Central American and Indonesian certified shade grown coffees), silky-rich and full-bodied with a caramel-like finish.

Papua New Guinea - a single varietal that is passive organic.

Farm Friendly Direct, SWP (Swiss Water Process) French Decaf – directly sourced, chemical free, dark roast.

Farm Friendly Direct, SWP (Swiss Water Process) Morning Decaf – directly sourced, chemical free, light roast.

Dear Richmond Parents,

Every year, Richmond parents donate to the Richmond School Foundation knowing that supporting small class sizes and excellence in education are crucial to maintaining our stellar school. This letter describes the fall kickoff of the Annual Richmond Foundation Parent Pledge Drive. The fall kickoff gives us a head start on achieving these goals each year and begins on October 3rd.

If you are new to our school, you may not know that twice each year—once in the fall and once in the spring—parents have donated funds to support additional classroom teachers and staff at our school. For returning Richmond families, your generous participation continues to be amazing. And your support just keeps growing! We have had over 50% participation from families at Richmond over the last two years. To expand our goals, we are seeking 66% participation or more this year. Go JMP! Go Richmond!

RSF ANNUAL PARENT PLEDGE DRIVE - MAKING IT SIMPLE AND EASY:

The aim of the Annual Parent Pledge Drive is the following:

Make giving easy – Just write a check, no need to buy or sell anything. And your donation is 100% tax-deductible.

Make giving consistent – Donate once in the fall and once in the spring, that's it.

Make giving manageable – As in past years, the suggested donation is the same amount as kindergarten parents pay for tuition each month. This year it is \$320. If kindergarten families can pay this amount every month, it seems manageable to ask everyone to consider donating the same amount just twice over the entire school year.

Make giving participation matter While the suggested donation is \$320, if this amount does not work for your family, any amount, no matter how large or small, makes a difference. Many gifts each year are above and below the suggested amount. Together we can do it. Issho ni ganbarou.

Make giving work for you Most families donate twice-a-year...but some donate just once...others donate monthly: divided over 12 months it is only \$53/month. Whatever is easiest for you.

Make giving matter – Every dollar donated goes to staffing.

MAINTAINING SMALL CLASS SIZES AND OUR DUAL-IMMERSION MODEL:

Donations to the Richmond Foundation are the only donations that can be used for staffing in public schools.

Your donations allow Richmond to have smaller class sizes than other schools.

Your donations also allow Richmond to avoid having mixed-grade classes and, in doing so, keep our two-classroom dual immersion model of instruction: no mixed grade classes means two or four classrooms in each grade allowing grade-specific instruction in English for half the day and in Japanese for the other half in every class.

Without your donations, larger mixed classes would be a reality.

WHAT YOUR DONATIONS HAVE DONE: Over the last three years, your donations to the Parent Pledge Drive have funded the following essential additional positions:

Three years ago: A reading specialist

Two years ago: An additional 1st grade teacher and a reading specialist

Last year: An additional 4/5th grade teacher

PARENT PARTICIPATION – IT ALL ADDS UP:

If 50% of parents donate \$320 once this year, we will raise \$67,500...
enough for 0.7 additional teachers.

If 100% of parents donate \$320 once this year, we will raise \$134,400...
enough for 1.3 additional teachers

If 100% of parents donate \$320 twice this year, we will raise \$268,800...enough for 2.6 additional teachers. Small class sizes with art and music anyone? Why not dream? We really can do it.

Any amount, no matter how large or small, makes a difference....it really does.

The clay creations students make will be fired in the school's kiln before they become part of the school's murals.
