#### April 24 - Update

STAFFING SITUATION – ART and LIBRARY ANYONE?: As you read in last week's Shinbun message from Cynthia Gilliam, in addition to all our classroom teachers, Richmond is planning on having a 1.0 gym teacher (have already), 0.5 reading/instructional specialist (have already), 0.5 cultural arts liaison specialist (have already) but also a 0.5 librarian/media specialist (new) and 0.5 art teacher (new) for the fall. It is wonderful. We can keep our successful dualimmersion model classroom teachers (one English and one Japanese teacher for two classrooms) and can have enrichment.


WE HAVE ENOUGH TO COVER A LIBRARIAN and ART TEACHER: The new 0.5 FTE librarian is covered by 0.5 FTE from PPS. Because of the awesome parent participation already in the Parent Pledge Drive (over 20%), we already now have enough funds to add 0.3 FTE from the Richmond Foundation to the 0.2 FTE from PPS to fund a 0.5 FTE art teacher! (FTE – full time equivalent or "school speak" for full time position.)

THE REMAINING SPRING PARENT PLEDGE DRIVE: Since we have enough in total funds for what we hoped to cover, we would like to concentrate in participation this spring – any amount from everyone. More donations and participation in the spring Parent Pledge Drive could allow us to increase from half time enrichment teachers to more time... maybe 60% time, or 75%...or fund something else in addition. (NOTE: Please remember that the final staffing decisions are not done by the PTA, or ONK or Richmond Foundation...they are done by the principal based on recommendations from the Richmond Site Council.)

- 1. So the theme is participation...any gift, any size, every family.
- 2. And the <u>goal is enrichment</u>...with a little extra from everyone, we may reach the level that we can have two full time enrichment teachers...go ahead and dream...art, music, something else. It is fantastic! (Please note that final decisions on how to use funding for staff not up to Richmond Foundation, PTA or ONK. They are up to the Richmond Site Council and the principal.)
