GEARING UP FOR...BETTER ATTENDANCE We did not meet the state minimum for attendance in December and dropped into the unacceptable report card range according to the state report card data.

If we don't get students here and on time, they will not learn. Students who miss entire days require extra work for staff and are disruptive to the other students. Letters are being mailed this week to students' families who have chronic attendance issues. It is helpful if all of us strive to keep our families healthy, rested, and to school on time. School attendance is one of the greater predictors for students who will report to work on time as adults. Let's start those healthy habits now.



GEARING UP FOR...SCIENCE AND OMSI

We will have OMSI (Oregon Museum of Science and Industry) assemblies February 13 and March 15. These assemblies were wildly popular with students last year and will continue to pique their science interest. All teachers have booked two hands-on science workshops lead by OMSI staff that is aligned with the PPS science curriculum to occur in the classrooms over the next few months. Run for Richmond donations paid for these activities. Additionally, the science fair is coming April 29th.





GEARING UP FOR...SITE COMMITTEE WORK We are approved to add two more classrooms at the 5th grade level next year. We will be able to house them in Rooms 205 and 17 while keeping two Pre-K classes and Art4Life in place. They will remain as they currently are in size and

enrichment activities such as calligraphy, taiko drumming, and fine arts in the play court or cafeteria. This will result in about 670 students onsite next year. We are glad to finally finish the K-5 expansion to four classrooms at every grade level. We also have a committee of parents meeting to discuss a long-term plan of building use, expansion, and site projects. These

us from 6:30to 7:30 in the cafeteria.

The district budget won't be out until after spring vacation or the first of April. We have been told that the class size will be going up which is the basis for the PPS budgets and how the schools are assigned teachers. Due to smaller classes at the 4th and 5th grade next year, we are planning that we will be one classroom teacher short of our model and partially short a full-time P.E. teacher. A classroom teacher cost about \$96K and the PE position was short \$25K this year. We will need to raise these amounts and the 1/3 matching funds to the tune of about \$160K. Richmond Foundation has done a great job of raising money this year. With leftover funds from last year combined with this year, we have approximately \$66K. In the coming months, we need to raise about \$94K to keep all our wonderful programs and staff in place.

5. My house isn't clean enough.

There is a misconception that Japanese people are "cleaner" than their American counterparts. We all have busy lives with children underfoot!

4. We don't have a sit-down dinner every night.

As long as you are providing food for your intern, have clear communications about family routines, you don't have to be June or Ward Cleaver.

3. Sometimes I vell at my kids.

Don't we all? Sometimes it feels uncomfortable to have an "audience" to witness your private behavior, but the interns are here to live in a family environment and experience those dynamics.

2. We want to wait until our children are older.

Our family first hosted an intern when my oldest daughter was in kindergarten and my twins were 18-month-old babies! (And again when my baby was only 4-months old!) The greatest benefit I have given my younger children is an early exposure to the Japanese language.

And the #1 reason is... We are remodeling our bathroom.

We do not require families to provide a private bathroom in order to host an intern. Traditionally, the interns bathe in the evenings and a simple schedule can resolve traffic flow problems.

We are still in need of **9** – that's **NINE**- Host Families for the new interns arriving at the end of March. Without the generous donation of our homes, we cannot receive enough interns to ensure one in every Japanese classroom.
