Principal's News

Welcome back from vacation!

We are so happy to see you and your children back at Richmond. Hopefully, you had many happy and warming experiences over the winter break. This New Year holds much promise and busy times for us. The New Year celebration at the Japanese garden on Jan 9th includes a discount pass enclosed in this newsletter. It would make a wonderful family event for this New Year.

We have also included a copy of the 2009-10 school report card from the state with this newsletter. While we continued to be an outstanding school last year, we need to be vigilant this year in several areas. Our attendance and tardies are rated and could cause us to miss the "Outstanding" rank if they continue to go down percentagewise. I know Richmond families have an extra challenge of getting here everyday, but it is important to be on time and in school for all students to learn well and so this is an important aspect of the report card.

Additionally, the math scores were raised this year by the state. Our students have to reach a higher score this year than is a normal gain for some students to reach in one year's time. While we anticipate our average math score will dip this year, we will be piloting a math supplemental program for 5th grade and one of the new math adoptions for next year at the 3rd grade. The district held off purchasing a new math program last year with the intent to do so this spring for all grade levels.

will be reading and answering questions about the books this spring. Thank you to our Library Assistant, Mitzi McCullen, for organizing these nine teams and the events. Watch for the science fair at the end of April and Run for Richmond coming on April 22nd.

Late openings continue to be dedicated to writing, differentiation, and strategies for different learners and observations by staff visiting each other's rooms. The district's 4th Monday professional development workshops focus on math. Our amazing Richmond teachers do all of this as well as achieve amazing outcomes in reading, Japanese, and other content areas. The upcoming TAG parent night on January 13 is from 6 to 7PM.

We are still in conversation with the district regarding next year and our growth. There is some misunderstanding that this is a threeteacher per grade level model so we hope to resolve this while growing and adding two fifth grade teachers during a year of more state budget cuts. This may be a hard sell. We will have a site committee starting the last Monday of each month at 4:30 from January to April for interested parents. Thank you to Richmond Foundation and parents who have raised about \$40k so far this year. That will purchase about half of a teacher's position.

Richmond's lottery meetings begin next month for new families on Feb 24th and March 16th at 7PM. Attending one of these is mandatory to apply to the program.
