# **Health Screenings**

Richmond will be holding the annual health screenings on Wednesday, February 29th.

Students in Pre-K, Kindergarten, 1st, 3rd and 5th grade will be tested for hearing, vision and dental.

Oregon law says that vision and hearing screenings shall be done to help find children's health problems. The nurse oversees these screenings.

If you do not want your child included in these screenings, you must submit a written request to the school each school year. Screening results for dental, hearing and vision are all sent home to parents.
