State assessments are on the way...

Starting in February, students in 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade will begin taking the Oregon Assessment of Knowledge and Skills (better known as OAKS). Students complete online assessments in reading and math, and our 5th arade students will also take the science assessment. These evaluations are just one piece of a year-long comprehensive assessment system. Teachers work very hard to prepare our students for these assessments without compromising the integrity of our immersion program and other aspects of the curriculum.

One change this year is that students will NO LONGER see their score on the screen upon completion of the test. Teachers still have immediate access to the scores and will work to find an appropriate time to share the results with students and families. If necessary, students have up to three opportunities to take the assessments. (continued next column)
