
A Message from Mr. Goldstein – Finishing the Year on a Positive Note

These dollars will allow our teachers and school community to continue to provide excellent experiences in the arts and sciences. Thank you so much for your wonderful show of support at our evening Music Program April 25th! All students K – 5 did a beautiful job! I was proud of their work and performance. Over the next six weeks we will learn about the "Percussion Family" of instruments and have some practice with them. The primary grades will enjoy some song-games with movement, while upper grades learn movement as it fits with a song. We continue with songs from a variety of cultures and come back to some American basics in June as we look towards the 4th of July!

We will continue to expand our knowledge of music terminology as it applies to and expresses music at hand. For example; our 100-year-old American favorite - "Take Me Out To The Ball Game" combines with three quarter time, a poem, and short story where students learn and do an "Ostinato" and the rhythmic value of a dotted half note as it relates to three quarter notes.

Kurabu is an all-inclusive Japanese summer day camp for children who are entering kindergarten through fifth grade in the Fall of 2013 and are currently in a Japanese immersion program or who speak Japanese at home. Kurabu is a partnership between Portland Parks & Recreation, Oya No Kai, and the Mt. Tabor Portland Parks & Recreation SUN Community School.

Kurabu is designed to offer children a bilingual summer camp experience that is rewarding, fun and reinforces their Japanese language skills. Our program is rich in cultural diversity and serves Japanese and non-Japanese children from the Portland Metro Region. All of our staff and volunteers have either studied Japanese, are bilingual or native speakers, and come to us from local and Japanese schools, universities and the community. The day at Kurabu starts at 9 AM and ends at 3 PM and is located at Mt. Tabor Middle School.
