Transitioning into fall– New classrooms, new teachers, new staff and new students have made Richmond a busy place this past month of September. "Transition" is the word of the October month for our students and is part of the work of our amazing new counselor, Mrs. Mouery. We will begin the riddle of the week, the word of the month and the new Bulldog Brigade of student conflict managers by this first quarter. We think all these new additions and changes will be supportive additions for our students.

New Conference Days - Conference signups are in he halls and parents must be sure to sign up for a conference time right before our November holiday break. Conferences will be over three days starting November 15th and finished by November 20th as school will be <u>closed Wednesday, November 21st</u>. Please check your calendars and plan for these meetings with your child's teacher.

Continuing Success – Even as we grow by about 50 students per year our students' state English test scores remain in the 90%. Our students continue with meeting or exceeding in Math and Reading. We will focus on students who are struggling to meet those goals and continue to benefit from the addition of special classes in the areas of PE, Library and Music this year. This is a great year for our 670 students.

- Our <u>student recognition</u> assemblies
- <u>Halloween party</u> which will be the last hour of the day on the 31st. The Halloween parade for the younger students will be in the afternoon starting at 1:15 p.m.
- <u>Late openings</u> occur on the third Wednesday of the month and are used for state mandated training such as TAG (talented and gifted) and district mandated Equity training.
- Monday after school is staff meeting days where the grade level or language teams will meet or as in the 4th Monday of every month teachers will attend district math training.

Please stop by and visit our <u>new library</u> in the south basement area. It is a much lighter and brighter area. Students are getting to library and other special classes two times per week. <u>Thanks to all parents who helped raise funds for staffing</u> which helped us provide supplemental classes such as music, PE, library, science, assemblies and artists this year. The Richmond <u>pleage week this fall for next year's staff</u>, starts October 29th.

Thank you for making our opening days smooth and successful. We appreciate our families who strive to get students here on time, homework done and happy kids coming into their classrooms. We think we have an amazing group of parents and we love working with your children. They make our day!

Even though we have added about 200+ students over the last three years, our test scores remain high and our students appear to grow and thrive in both languages. We are working to make this environment positive and supportive of the time students spend with us. We hope to continue the high level of parent involvement as guided by our parent leadership in PTA, Richmond Foundation and Oya No Kai. We begin the year with an introduction to the basic elements of music: Rhythm, Beat, Melody and Harmony through song and movement. Reading and Language skills are enhanced through rhythm and rhyme as well as phrasing and expression.

At all grade levels we will learn about instrument families, great composers and their famous compositions, various styles of music from different time periods of history. We will sing and experience traditional folk songs and music of America as well as from countries and cultures around the world.

Students at different levels will learn and be able to use music vocabulary and recognize music symbols as it applies to the music at hand. This paves the way for reading rhythm values and notes.

These experiences and skills will help students to successfully participate in a Middle School performance class.

buckets to gauge and intentionally impact our own feelings and the feelings of others. Simply put, when our buckets are empty we feel bad, but when our buckets are full we feel great. Empathy is best taught when modeled, so, every classroom will also decorate a class bucket and work to fill it over time. "Drops" in the buckets will note

students' acts, observations, and experiences of empathy amongst one another. Drops will be read aloud and celebrated each month during one of my visits.

Custodians, cooks, bus drivers, office personnel, teachers, and specialists have buckets, too! You will soon find an ORANGE staff bucket next to Ms. Pruitt's mailbox outside of the main office. I am thrilled to invite students and parents to complete a drop with a positive thought to fill our staff's bucket. I will read your drops for staff during meetings and assemblies, and I know this will light up their months.


