Safety Messages

Students MUST wait in the cafeteria

Please remind your child to wait in the cafeteria and NOT in the halls in the morning. There is no supervision for them before 8:00.

Child Waiting for Tutoring?

We do not have supervision for your children after 2:15. Your child/children need to stay with you at all times. If you are waiting for your child's Japanese tutor time you **MUST** be with him or her in the building or on the playground.

New Card Readers and Access to the Building

Richmond is receiving new card readers for teachers along with security cameras. Portland Public Schools is improving security in all of their schools. One way to do this is to add card readers and security cameras to the schools that do not currently have them.

During the month of March we will receive our card readers and security camera with a monitor in the office.

What does this mean for you?

- 1- The East and West doors as well as the cafeteria doors will be open from 7:30-8:15 for drop off. They will open again at 1:45 for pick up.
- 2 After 8:15, all doors are programmed to lock except for the front door.
- 3- If you arrive after 8:15 you must use the front doors to access the building and check-in (Remember to always check-in at the office).
- 4- For dismissal the East and West doors and the cafeteria doors will open at 1:45.
