Creative Project - This is a project of your choice. The project should be designed to help you improve areas that you feel you need more experience in. Goals should be production focused - story development, editing, lighting, composition, sound design, graphics, directing.

Franklin Stories - You will create a profile piece on an interesting member of the Franklin community. Think about people who are involved in extracurricular activities, or come from an interesting background, or are just doing something cool that you feel the whole community should know about. You have the option of working collaboratively with another student in the class or student in directing.

Website - You will design and create a website for yourself. Your best work will be available on this website, the goal is to create a digital space to showcase your skills and abilities.

Classroom norms and expectations: We will behave as professionals during meets. Professionalism means showing respect for each other's ideas, contributions and time.
