Kellogg Middle School Rebuild



A New Model for Middle Schools

Opening in the Fall of 2021, the new Kellogg Middle School will represent the vision of Portland Public Schools to create a new model for middle school education, offering expanded options and programs for students.

As part of a public engagement process, a diverse community has shared its goals and aspirations for this new neighborhood middle school. The Kellogg site will include over 100,000 square feet of new construction, including a performing arts stage, a multi-purpose gym and assembly space, a large, flexible commons space, and dedicated outdoor learning spaces. The school will be a focal point of its Southeast Portland neighborhood, offering a new educational center and resource hub for the community.

Although the old Kellogg Middle School has been demolished, components of the old building have been salvaged and will be integrated into the new building, honoring the memories of the historic school far into the future.



Cafeteria/Commons

The cafeteria/commons serve as the heart of this new middle school, offering space for student gatherings and after-hours, community activities.

Learning Suites

As part of a shared learning environment, groups of classrooms will be connected together on each floor in an extended learning area to promote greater collaboration.

Performing Arts

The performing arts stage, located next to a dedicated music room, serves as a teaching space and opens to the gymnasium through an acoustic partition, offering flexible space for performances, assemblies and other community events.

Community Resources

The new design includes community partner and support spaces, providing a connection to the neighborhood at the center of the new school.

Athletic Facilities

In addition to use for assemblies and performances, the gymnasium allows for two PE classes to use the space simultaneously, with a divider curtain. The outdoor, multi-use field and walking path allow for a variety of PE activities and after-hours community use.

STEAM Lab/Learning Garden

The STEAM lab, located next to the student learning garden, will be used for maker space activities and project-based learning opportunities. The learning garden extends the classroom to the outdoors with a natural boulder seating space, tools for demonstrating energy generation and areas for educational planting.

Building as a Learning Tool

The entire campus will serve as a learning tool for studies in energy use and sustainability. Digital dashboards will provide real time data on the amount of energy used and produced, water savings and air quality monitoring for the building. These features can then be incorporated into enhanced learning experiences.
