CAFETERIA/COMMONS & CROSSROAD ATRIUM

The commons serves as the heart of the remodeled school acting as a welcoming space at the main entrance. The Crossroads Atrium connects all major wings of the building and all three classroom levels.

SCIENCE WING

Science labs are consolidated near the front of the school and highlighted to serve as a shining example of the new school.

PERFORMING ARTS

A brand new, state-of-the-art music and theater facility will serve the school and the local community.

COMMUNITY RESOURCES


A child care center, public health clinic, and community food pantry will continue to serve the community.

ATHLETIC FACILITIES

The new gym building includes a 1,700-seat main gym, auxiliary gym, weight room and a wrestling/dance room. The updated field area includes a new softball field and the south turf field has space for baseball, softball, and soccer.

CAREER TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Students in the newly modernized school will have access to specialty labs for digital design, engineering, robotics, digital art, biomedical, sculpture, construction, and sustainable agriculture. In addition, a brand-new Makerspace will support project based learning.



This new 21st century learning environment will provide Portland's most diverse student population, who speak over 30 languages, with new facilities, programs and opportunities for success.



CONTINUING A LEGACY

For several months, the Madison Renaming Committee engaged the community through robust outreach efforts. They spent countless hours in careful consideration of the most appropriate name to fit the school's C.R.E.E.D (Community, Respect, Education, Equity, Diversity) values.

They selected Leodis V. McDaniel, a greatly respected and highly celebrated former principal of Madison High. McDaniel was one of only a handful of Black High school principals in Oregon in the 1970s and 1980s and was tasked with leading Madison through desegregation and busing. McDaniel was wildly popular with students and staff while earning numerous awards and accolades from the many community organizations to which he contributed.

COMMUNITY RESOURCES

McDaniel High works collaboratively with a number of community partners including College Possible, IRCO (Immigrant and Refugee Community Organization), Jobs 101, Latino Network, Portland State University Trio Programs, and Step Up. Each of these play an important role in connecting with our students and families to enable their success.

PRIORITIZING STUDENT SUCCESS

At McDaniel there are Advanced Placement as well as dual credit options for several of our program offerings through Portland Community College, Clackamas Community College, and Portland State University. This provides students with the opportunity to earn both high school and college credit and achieve their future dreams.
