






## REPORT - SITE ORGANIZATION PLAN

Upon the conclusion of CMPC Meeting 5, Bora synthesized a single conceptual option that was then forwarded to the cost estimating team for review and pricing. This conceptual option addresses many, but not all, of the ideas expressed by the CMPC. The selection of this option does not indicate that it is the final recommendation. Rather, it is the option that is most indicative of the likely construction cost. There will be ample time for community review and revise the design direction once the project is funded and moves forward.

DESIGN <u>JUSTICE IS WHAT LOVE LOOKS LIKE IN PUBLIC</u> SPACES. SPATIAL DESIGN SHOULD BE A Deep reflected and projected expression of care for a beloved community expressed in physical form. FOR NEARLY EVERY INJUSTICE THERE IS AN ARCHITECTURE, A PLAN, A DESIGN TO SUSTAIN IT.

DESIGN JUSTICE FORWARDS THE <u>RADICAL</u> LIBERATORY VISION OF RACIAL, SOCIAL AND CULTURAL <u>REPARATION</u> THROUGH THE <u>PROCESS AND OUTCOMES</u> OF DESIGN.

DESIGN JUSTICE SEEKS TO CHALLENGE THE PRIVILEGE AND POWER STRUCTURES THAT USE ARCHITECTURE AND DESIGN AS A TOOL OF OPPRESSION.

At the root of housing, transportation and economic injustice there are remnants of redlining and convents that continue to extract wealth and codify structural or de facto segregation. At the root of environmental racism is an infrastructure that exhausts 39% of our carbon emissions, demands 40% of our energy production, and drives climate change. At the root of the unjust policing is a prison industrial complex sustained by spaces that extract human dignity and economic potential from marginalized people in the name of profit. At the root of food and commercial insecurity is a capital market system that prioritizes profits over people at every turn. The force of these issues are often invisible but they are not insurmountable.

# **POWER**

Control of our built environment, of the land and all of its derivatives, is by far the most efficient way to consolidate power.

Those who hold power in place establish the policies, procedures as directives for society at large.


By controlling land and subsequently the material realities beholden to it makes it substantially easier to control people, en masse, shape societies and cultures.

To make fair in the present and affirm a standard of fairness in the future.

#### EQUIT)


To acknowledge a past of inequity, make fair or stabilize in the present, and affirm a standard of fairness in the future.

#### **JUSTICE**

To repair for past of injustice, make fair in the present, and to remove barriers to progress in the future.

#### LIBERATION

To repair for past of injustice, make fair in the present, remove barriers to progress and affirmatively influence future outcomes.
