How can we make schools more accessible?

In 1995 Portland voters approved a \$196.7 million bond measure to improve PPS schools. Of this amount, \$9 million was allocated toward making building accessibility improvements. This allocation was the beginning of the implementation of the Portland Public Schools Transition Plan. A total of 87 schools and five other PPS buildings received some accessibility improvements, such as modified parking spaces, entrances, restrooms and ramps. New or upgraded elevators were installed at 15 schools, including nine high schools.

Additionally, each year the district completes numerous improvements to accommodate the needs of students, employees, or community members with special needs. These projects include the installation of ramps and handrails, restroom modifications, power-operated door openers, accessible parking spaces and specialized accessibility equipment.
