First Week Schedule

What to Bring?

- Full Water Bottle
- Mask (no gaiters or scarves)
- Something to write with
- Notebook
- Graph paper for math
- Planner if used

After the first day

- Chromebook or Laptop (if you have)
- Or a Chromebook will be assigned on the second day



What will in-person school be like?

- **All new instruction will be presented in the morning virtual classes.**
- **In the afternoon, students will practice and deepen understanding of concepts learned in the morning.**
- **Students will sometimes use their Chromebooks, but teachers have been working on creative ways to implement interactive, collaborative extension activities while still keeping students safe and socially distant.**
- **Examples: Language Arts plans to use “Reader’s Theater”, math plans to use mini-whiteboards and outdoor graphing activities (chalk on blacktop). All classes can have students turn desks around and work in small groups while still remaining 6 feet apart.**

Safety Protocols

- **Masks Worn at All Times (mandatory for CDL)**
- **Desks Spaced 6 feet Apart**
- **Social Distancing**
- **Bathroom Procedures**
- **Hand Sanitizer and Hand Washing**
- **No Visitors, Volunteers, or Parents in Building**



Ventilation

- Building HVAC outside air dampers have been adjusted
- Symptom spaces, classrooms/instruction spaces and other selected rooms have been provided with a portable high-efficiency particulate air (HEPA) room ventilators. These HEPA room ventilators provide ultrafine-particle filtration.
- Windows will be kept open

Sanitation

Will desks be cleaned/sanitized between classes?

Desks need to be sanitized between each class. One student will be assigned to use a spray bottle to spray each desk with a solution at the end of the class. This task will be rotated to different students each day.

What is the sanitizing solution? Is it safe?

[Oxivir TB RTU](#) is used in all schools for sanitizing desks between classes. It has an excellent safety and environmental profile. It is non-irritating to eyes and skin, and breaks down to oxygen and water.

How will custodians keep the whole school sanitized?

Custodians will clean high touch surfaces throughout the day. Each night, our custodians will follow a thorough cleaning and sanitizing protocol

Symptom Space and Testing

- Students with symptoms (ie., chills, cough, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, new loss of taste or smell, vomiting, diarrhea or new rash) will be sent to the designated [Symptom/Isolation Space](#). Nurse and/or Health Assistant will respond.
- Students or staff identified with symptoms consistent with COVID-19 will be fully screened. If there is a consent form, they will self-administer the [Abbott BinaxNOW test](#) COVID-19 test under the guidance of the COVID test administrator (health assistant)
- If no signed parent consent form is on file, the student's parent/guardian will be referred to their health provider and the student will be sent home.
- Student and staff confidentiality will be maintained.

What if a Student, Staff, or Family Member Gets COVID?

- Families should use the PPS [daily illness self screening checklist](#).
- If a student is ill, they must stay home
- Staff, student, or student families should call the school to report any illness or COVID-19 events.
- Staff will follow and use the [Symptom Tracker Tool](#) and/or [COVID-19 Case Protocol](#) for tracking and appropriate exclusion guidance from school nurse, nurse consultant, or building administrator.
- With support from MESD, schools will conduct contact tracing and notify classmates or other close contacts and provide advice on quarantine.

At the end of each school day, in the cafeteria, we will provide a grab and go breakfast, lunch, and dinner to any student who wants it. Meals are meant to be eaten at home. There will be no eating allowed at school or on the buses.
