Following are some graduation related reminders:

**Important:** May 1st will be the deadline for completing all **off-campus credits** (such as independent study, Health, etc.). If you are taking an off campus class (for example, through BYU or PSU), make sure to SCHEDULE YOUR FINAL TESTING TIME WITH YOUR CHOSEN PROCTOR. Call your counselor with any questions.

- 1. Remember the <u>60-Day Rule</u> started Monday, April 1st. Seniors are encouraged to avoid any actions that could bring disciplinary consequences and result in disqualification from participation in graduation.
- 2. Senior Finals are May 30-31 in your regular class schedule. Important: May 31 is the LAST day to complete all work for credit.
- 3. Teachers report Senior Failures to Counselors by Fri, May 31 at 3:30pm; parents will be notified (if they're not aware) if a student will NOT graduate with the class. Some students are close, others need every class plus off-campus credits to graduate. This is THE STUDENTS' responsibility.
- 4. Once a senior has cleared the check-out process (below) May 30-31, take signed check-out sheet to the table in the main hall on May 30-31 from noon 3:30pm to pick up tickets for graduation.
- 5. **Tickets: Each student can receive 10 tickets to graduation.** Obtain additional tickets from friends who may not need all of their tickets or notify Sharon Dailey, counseling secretary, in advance, of your need for additional tickets. Tickets are available after you complete Senior Check-Out (below).
- 6. After Senior Finals on May 31, there will be a MANDATORY **Senior class meeting in the Auditorium at 3:20pm**.

#### PICK UP YOUR CORDS/PINS PRIOR TO SENIOR AWARDS ASSEMBLY

- 1. Cords and pins will be handed out May 30-31 in the Main Hall across from the office from noon-3:30pm
- 2. Wear your caps, cords and pins to the Senior Awards Assembly on Monday, June 3<sup>rd</sup> and graduation.
- 3. These cords/pins include: Academic Letters and pins; NHS cords and pins; CTE/Health Occ. cords; PCC Dual Credit Honor cords; etc.

- a. THIS REHEARSAL IS REQUIRED

- c. Park in the Garden Garage at no charge during rehearsal only
- d. Enter the Memorial Coliseum through the Pine Court entrance

- a. For parents/guests, the main doors will open at 6:45pm; they are allowed only in the seating area. No admittance to the robing area.
- b. Students arrive at 6:00 pm to 6:30 pm and go directly to the tables in front of the Pine Court entrance (lower level) to receive their Grad Night Party wrist band. No one will be admitted onto the busses without one.
