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What Can I Expect To Learn?

What Can I Expect To Learn?

- Your parental rights under ESSA (Every Student Succeeds Act).



The purpose of Title III (3) is to help ensure that English Learners (ELs) attain English language proficiency and meet state academic standards. Federal funding is provided to assist states and districts in accomplishing this.



Objectives of Title III

- To attain English proficiency
- To achieve at high levels in core academic subjects
- To develop high-quality language instruction educational programs and employ highly qualified teachers
- To promote family and community participation and engagement.



General Information

- PPS serves approximately 45,000+ students
- Approximately 4,500 of those students qualify for the ELD program and make 10% of all PPS students.
- Most of our Multilingual Learners are US-born, and approximately 700 of Multilingual Learners were born outside the US and enrolled in a US school for the first time in the last three years.
- The most common languages in PPS are: Spanish, Vietnamese, Chinese, Somali, Russian.



Faubion Information

- Our school serves approximately 607 students in Kindergarten through 8th grade.
- English Learners make up approximately 17% of our K-8 student population.
- The most common languages in our school (after English) are Spanish and Aketeco.



What happens when my child exits the program?

Parents receive a letter each year to notify them of their student's English language proficiency progress.

Your student is monitored for 4 years to ensure they continue to make academic progress.

Parental Notification of ELD services



PPS must provide a letter of notification with 30 days of testing.

- The letter must include eligibility, test results & program
- The letter includes information on the right to waive services
- The letter informs families who to contact for questions
- The letter will be provide in the five major language
- Your school & PPS must make an effort to provide interpretation and translation services, upon request



Providing Language Support to English Learners

English Learners are entitled to appropriate language support services to become proficient in English.

- At Faubion, newcomers have a daily group for beginning English as well as supports in their classroom such as bilingual labels and schedules, devices for translation, language learning apps.
- For K-5 students who are progressing, an ELD teacher meets regularly with the classroom teacher to plan lessons that support the learning of Multilingual Learners.
- K-5 students who need extra reading support have a daily reading support group.
- 6-8 students receive ELD support during a class period daily or during their Language Arts class.

Providing Meaningful Access to Core Program

English Learners are entitled to participate equally in the standard instructional program. (Math, Reading, Science & Social Studies)

At Faubion, students are not removed from their classes during these core content times with the exception of newcomers who may receive basic English instruction during a part of a core content time.



How Long Will My Student be in ELD?

Students move through the English Language Learner (ELL) program at their own pace; research says it can take at least 5 to 7 years to acquire academic English



How do students exit ELD?

In January-March,
all ELD students take a
standardized state test of
English proficiency called
"ELPA21" which is the English
Language Proficiency
Assessment.

ELPA21 has 3 levels:

Emerging, Progressing, and Proficient. Proficient is the highest level and a student who reaches Proficient is ready to exit ELD. The student will continue to be monitored for 4 years.





Family Engagement

- You have the ability to influence your child's education more than any teacher or school.
- You know your child best. Share information about your child's interests and abilities with teachers.
- Participate in school and district-wide parent meetings, classes and events.
- Ask to see progress reports on your child and the school.
