# WHS Site Council Goals 2016-2017

- Graduation rate: Achieve graduation rate of 95% or better; no sub groups below 5% of the average (same as district milestone)
- Exclusionary discipline: reduce exclusionary disciplinary actions by 50% for all sub- groups
- Attendance Goal: 90% of students attending 90% or better for all sub-groups for average daily attendance; reduce chronic and severe from 30% to 20%
- 100% of freshmen on track for on-time graduation (same as district milestone).
- Needs more discussion AP Goal: Increase the percentage of Wilson graduates who successfully complete advanced coursework/dual credit/professional experience (e.g. more kids taking AP classes, more minority kids taking AP classes, AP scores of 3+, capstone course in drama, honors designations, internships) <suggestion to remove internship, honors for this year>; need to determine how we'll measure items outside of AP
- Teacher professional development: every teacher is actively involved in a PLC (professional learning community) that results in a specific goal and action plans for professional development delivered by October 4.

#### **Minutes:**

- 1. Welcome, introductions, questions, goals, by-laws, roles, review of norms, etc. (8:30 10:30 a.m.)
- 2. Table groups review entire data packet (10:30 11:45 a.m.)
- 3. Lunch
  - a. Wilson Way (WW) review
  - b. Discussion of WW recognition system
    - i. Token economy?
    - ii. How to reach more students
    - iii. Do we want to track who gets them?
  - c. Climate team will remain a Site Council sub-committee
    - i. Staff membership will likely remain the same
    - ii. Student and parent membership was not decided

## 4. Attendance

- a. Excused v. non-excused discussion
  - i. Focusing on students who exceed the threshold and are still being very successful is a waste of scant resources
  - ii. Parent outreach to increase excused absence communication to streamline interventions
- b. Potential for Measure 98 money to fund an attendance intervention specialist
  - i. Teachers would appreciate more information about students who are absent
  - ii. Focus on the chronic (middle) attendance issues?
  - iii. A "deeper dive" will help target interventions better
  - iv. Seek highly relational person
- c. Last year's goal will be updated in the sub-group to follow

#### 5. Discipline

- a. Discussion of disproportionality and maintaining the focus for next year
  - i. School climate re: referrals
  - ii. Maintain restorative practices
  - iii. Shift the goal from exclusionary incidents to classroom incidents
- b. Goal writing tabled for IL meeting because of the shift to classroom incidents

#### 6. Graduation Rate

- a. 94.7% of students who stayed at Wilson for 2017 prior to summer completion data entry
  - i. State data will be available later; 90.3% for 2016
  - ii. State data will likely be a slightly lower rate
    - 1. Includes students who came to Wilson at any point for any length of time and left without registering at another high school
    - 2. Includes some students who may have registered with other high schools but Wilson was unable to track
- b. State completion rate for 2016 is 94.3%
  - i. Within five years of entering high school
  - ii. Includes regular, modified, extended, and adult high school diplomas in addition to GEDs
- c. Goal: Achieve graduation rate of 90% or better; no sub groups below 5% of the average
- d. Suggest a "deeper dive" into GPAs disaggregated by race; i.e., is there a difference in one's diploma and education based on race hidden within our 90+% graduation rate

## 7. Advanced Placement (AP)

- a. 2017 percentage of students who take AP exams has increased from 25% in 2015-16 to 44%, which we would still like to increase
- b. Enrollment is still very disproportionate by race
  - i. Continue to track who is taking the classes
  - ii. Looking for current increase to continue with untracked 10<sup>th</sup> grade humanities to 100% of students taking at least one AP class (and successfully completing an exam eventually)
- c. Resources for student support is still a need, e.g., there were significantly fewer students who had the opportunity to take a practice exam last year than the previous year
- d. Draft Goals:
  - i. In CCE, every freshman will identify an advanced course in core and elective that s/he will take before they graduate from Wilson. Agreed upon.
  - ii. Increase the percentage of students who take an AP course from \_\_ to \_\_. Add subgroup component.
  - iii. Increase the percentage of students who successfully complete at least one AP exam from \_\_ to \_\_.
