Freshman Success Teams – Instructional Specialist update

The District, in partnership with Stand for <u>Children/Center for High School Success</u> is implementing a new initiative called Freshman Success Teams in all PPS high schools. The research came out of <u>University of Chicago</u>.

Teams of teachers use this time to basically identify and support focal students so that the freshmen can become sophomores ON TIME with as high a GPA as possible, attending school as much as possible, all indicators of graduation as well as college/post-secondary program persistence - so basically success after high school.

The work started last spring with an introduction to the initiative and professional development around student support using a data-driven system and student meeting protocols. Training occurs a couple of times a year for leads, and monthly meetings with the other high schools happen with visits and classroom observations in the other buildings among other things.

Essentially, the reason we provide an additional release period for all Frosh core teachers is this Freshman Success Teams Initiative. Teams of ninth grade teachers have been organized into: Mind, Body, and Spirit.

The Frosh Teams are tasked with using their release periods for:

- 1. Community meetings (interdisciplinary) to build common practices and provide student support by pushing into classes, calling home, organizing data and interventions
- 2. Subject Meetings (within each discipline) to implement common curriculum, instructional strategies and assessments in course-alike teams
- 3. Twice-monthly **Student Intervention Meetings** (interdisciplinary PLUS school support staff, counselors, case managers, Instructional Specialist, Administrators and other teachers who may have time to volunteer to drop in)
- 4. Planning Freshman Community events and activities such as PSAT day
- 5. Using community-wide time as a PLC, sharing best practices and learning from each other an the mentor text: Zarettta Hammond's *Culturally Relevant Teaching and the Brain*

Work is ongoing, and this committed team utilizes their release period EVERY OTHER DAY in order to support this freshman on-track initiative. They have been reaching out to gather anecdotal feedback for the twice monthly meetings which are based on data we pull from 8th grade and later from our own system. The data that is most helpful in most cases is not as much attendance, grades or test scores, but the stories of our interactions and conversations with students!
