Through out the 12-week program participants will learn theater performance and production skills, attend rehearsals and work towards a final production on April 6th.

Being a part of the Astor Drama program is a responsibility and a commitment. You are member of a team and in order for the team to function well, all team members need to be present and working together. We will put on a production that you, your family and friends will be proud of and that takes dedication.

It will be fun and I have no doubt you will be a success!

- We need you at rehearsals when you are supposed to be there!
- All cast and crew are important to the production no matter the role they are assigned.
- Commitment, compassion, listening, the willingness to learn, create, and participate are key to everyone's success.
- Absences for medical appointment, family matter, outside activity need to be preapproved / arranged w/ director and signed by a parent. (Preferably 1 week in advance)
- Absences from illness / emergency can be communicated in person or via text or email to the director.
- After three unexcused absences the cast member will be contacted and may be dropped from the production. (30 minutes late to rehearsals without notice will be marked as "unexcused")
- Zero tolerance for disrespectful and inappropriate behavior. All participants are expected to act appropriately, practice respectful behavior towards one another and all supporting participants (volunteers, parents, etc.) and to the show itself. Any disrespectful behavior and / or negative attitude may result in dismissal from the production.
- Respect the rehearsal process and the performance space.
- Your grades are important! Don't let your homework slip because you have lines to learn but also catching up on schoolwork is not an excuse to miss rehearsal. Communicate and check in w/ director if needed.

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- Provide students with an understanding of basic theater, working to increase their confidence, self-expression skills, and public speaking abilities.
- Increase community collaboration opportunities between youth, parents, and teachers.
