## 7/8th Grade Wonder (Start-Up) Band

Do you have friends in band and wish you could play an instrument? If you missed out in 6<sup>th</sup> grade you can still learn to play in the Wonder Band! No previous musical experience needed, and info about getting instruments will be provided on the first day (some instruments are available through the school). This class covers two years of instruction in one year. This class meets daily during school hours. (YEAR LONG)



# 7/8th Grade Concert (Intermediate) Band

After Cadet Band, most students go into this group. You will continue developing instrumental technique, ensemble skills and even learn a few rock tunes to play at the Staff vs. 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Basketball Game! This class meets daily during school hours. *All jazz students must be in either Concert Band or Symphonic Band*. (YEAR LONG)

## 7/8th Grade Symphonic (Advanced) Band

This band plays more challenging music, competes at two festivals per year, and learns a wide variety of music. If you want to move beyond mastery of your instrument to artistry in music, this band's for you! This class meets daily during school hours. *All jazz students must be in either Concert Band or Symphonic Band*. (YEAR LONG)



#### 7/8 Grade Intermediate/Advanced Art

**7/8 Intermediate/Advanced Art:** This class will build on first year projects to explore art mediums and concepts in greater depth. Students will learn to work more independently to craft artworks that reflect their own stories and purposes. Projects include printmaking exchanges, murals, botanical illustration, figure drawing, protest art, and more. (YEAR LONG)



#### 7<sup>th</sup> Grade Yearbook

Yearbook staff creates, edits and finalizes the Beaumont yearbook! We also enjoy capturing the year through photos. In this class you will work on editing, formatting, aesthetics, cropping and managing sales. If you enjoy preparing interesting formats and can work on a team, this is a great class for you! #### \_SEMESTER ELECTIVES\_

These classes are one semester for each and some of them have already been paired up. Most but not all classes include 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students.



#### 8th Grade Health & 7/8th Grade Mirroring Masterpieces (paired)

8<sup>th</sup> Grade Health: This course will offer specific instruction about healthy choices from varying points of view, as well as opportunities for guided discussions for each of these components. The topics and assessments for this course are designed based on Oregon Department of Education's Middle School Health Standards. Topics include: nutrition, fitness, awareness of people with differences, bullying/exclusion, healthy relationships, mental and emotional health/illnesses, awareness of drugs/alcohol and addiction, reproductive body parts, sexual health, disease prevention, pregnancy/human development, and finally, the importance of sleep and sunscreen!
