Hay'ada Caafimaadka Oregon (OHA) iyo Waaxda Caafimaadka Degmada Multnomah waxay siidaayeen maanta shuruudo cusub oo ah sida loo aqoonsanayo qofka la kulma qof qaba xanuunada faafaya iyo sida loo wargalinayo Dugsiyada K-12:

Oregon uma tixgalin doonto hadda wixii ka dambeeyaa qofka xiran afsaabka ee dugsiyada kula kulma (oo ay ka mid yihiin basaska dugsiyada) inuu soo gaadhay xanuunka faafaya iyada oo aan loo eegin masaafada ay isku jireen. Kala fogaanshaha dadku ay kala fogaanayaa wali waa sii soconey aa intii suurtagal ah ee ay sameyn karaan.

MCHD, OHA, iyo Waaxda Waxbarashada ee Oregon waxay farayaan dugsiyadu inay diirada saaraan sida loo aqoonsanayo qofka la kulmay qof qaba xanuunka faafaya iyo agabyada wargalinta:

- In la is qaadsiyaa xanuunka faafaya wuxuu dhacaa marka waqtiyada cuntada la wada cunayo (marka ay ardaydu ayna xirneyn afsaabka);
- In la is qaadsiyaa waqtiyada la wada joogo gudaha dhismaha ee waxbarashada la qaadanayo, iyada oo aan la xirneyn afsaabka ama hawlaha manhajka ee dheeraadka la qaadanayo. (Xusuusin: PPS waxay sii wadaysaa inay weydiisato qof kasta inuu xирто afsaabka waqt kasta marka ay ku sugar yihin dhismayaasha dugsiyada (gudaha iyo dibadaba) iyo marka ay la socodaan basaska dugsiyada. Wuxuu aqoonsanahay dhammaan dugsiyadayadu, inay jirto habab gaar ah oo ay khatar xanuunku ku iman karto la isku qaadsiyo. Wuxuu sii wadaynaa inaan la socono iyada oo aan goobahani u sameynayo habraacyo ah sidii loo xakameyn lahaa iyo sidii hoos loogu dhigi laha faafintaanka xanuunka).

Dear Multnomah County students and families,

COVID is spreading quickly in our community, and the emergence of the Omicron variant has forced Public Health to mount a dramatic course change in hopes of meeting this new challenge.

We know it is very important for children and youth to learn in person for the sake of their overall learning and well-being. The changes we describe below should do more to help schools stay open and keep students in class while addressing the reality that this virus is becoming widespread in our community.

People who are vaccinated can still get COVID, especially if it has been more than five months since a person got the original shots (two Pfizer, two Moderna, or one Johnson & Johnson). But most vaccinated people who get sick will get a cold-like illness and feel better after a few days at home. Many may not feel sick at all.

The sheer speed of Omicron means that many people are exposed, infected and contagious before they even know they have it, which can put schools at increased risk. The best protection under these circumstances are vaccines, boosters, and masks to avoid serious illness. And it is also why, this week, Multnomah County is also advising schools to change course on contact tracing. This means you may not get a notification if your child is exposed.

The Multnomah County Health Department recommends that **as resources allow**, schools prioritize contact tracing only in the following circumstances:

- Exposures during meetings when masks can't be worn. This approach will require assignment and tracking of "lunch" pods.
- Any indoor leisure or extracurricular activities that do not include masks.

Multnomah County Health Department recommends that schools continue:

- Disinfecting public areas, such as gymnasiums, restrooms, and classrooms. They can return to full school activities after a negative test result.
- Keeping sick students home, or have a positive COVID test, to stay home and isolate for five (5) days. They can return on Day 6 with a well-fitting mask. If they are feeling better, they do not need a negative test to return.
- Making sure everyone is using a well-fitted mask as much as possible.

Get every recommended COVID vaccine they are eligible for including boosters, as soon as possible.

- Use well-fitting masks indoors.
- Keep sick kids home when they are sick, even if they test negative for COVID. Anyone who has tested positive should wait for their fever to be gone for 24 hours (without the use of medications that lower fever).

We want to acknowledge the profound pandemic fatigue people are experiencing and the concern you have for your family and school community. Like you and so many others, we are determined as ever to protect our community. Your support to flatten the curve and protect our schools has helped keep our schools and households safe, and we thank you for your continued efforts per ospital's latest update. We appreciate your continued partnership in this test-moving and truly unprecedented situation.
