Grant Highlights

- **Freshmen Communities:** All freshmen belong to a community of approximately 85 students each. Each community includes language arts, modern world history and physics. In addition, students take other course courses and choose from a variety of electives.
- **Advanced Placement Courses include:** Human Geography, Language, Chemistry, Physics, Calculus, AP Environmental Science.
- **PSU & PCC Dual Credit Courses include:** History, English, Journalism, Spanish, Math, Science, English, and Career Technical Education Programs. All seniors take dual credit English.
- Grant has an award-winning student publication called Grant Magazine. The magazine’s staff writers can earn college journalism credits from PSU.
- Grant is committed to providing equity in all aspects of the school community. Students have played a significant role in the addition of a number of courses related to race and culture and hold school wide Race Talks four times per year.



College and Career Learning

Grant’s College and Career Center works with the Counseling Department to help guide students as they prepare for the future. The Career Coordinator and parent volunteers staff the drop-in center and provide information about careers and pathways to obtain those careers through study at community colleges, colleges, universities, apprenticeships or workforce training programs.

The Career Center is open eight hours daily and also offers:

- Access to Naviance, a web-based college and career resource
- A schedule of college representatives visiting Grant throughout the year
- Year-round opportunities for career exploration, guest speakers, offsite career visits, job shadows and internships

Grant Transition: Students and staff will call the Marshall High School campus home for two years as modernization of Grant's landmark Northeast Portland building takes place.
