To do that, we must build our region's transportation system on a foundation of social equity. As a region, we need to reduce congestion on our highways and roads by:

- Preventing mass displacement and restore housing affordability;
- Investing in new bus & MAX lines to help people get where they need to go;
- Ensuring that transportation investments are transparent and accountable to the community;
- Making a multimodal transportation system that is safe and accessible for people of all ages, abilities, and backgrounds; and
- Guaranteeing funding for programs and operations that increases access to transportation options.

The Getting There Together Coalition

was formed in 2017 in response to growing concerns that the Portland metropolitan region wasn't adequately planning to build a comprehensive infrastructure and transportation system.

We believe in providing travel options to alleviate growing freeway congestion, empower working Oregonians to get to jobs, and ensure all the region's residents prosper from an equitable, sustainable, and climate-smart transit investments.

We work to ensure transportation investments do not lead to displacement, and that housing investments are aligned with existing and future transportation investments, so that getting around does not become cost prohibitive for community members who finally have a place to call home.

We are fighting for transportation choices that offer people more travel options and increased access to opportunities and amenities: jobs, housing, education, family, community, health, and recreation
