
4-Year Cohort Graduation Rate Milestone





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

Subject: Timeline for Jefferson PK-8 Cluster Enrollment Balancing

This Memorandum provides an update on the timeline and process for Jefferson PK-8 Cluster enrollment balancing.

Since October, more than a thousand community members have contributed thoughts and suggestions for improving the educational experience for students in North and Northeast Portland. PPS received nearly 700 pieces of written feedback, all of which is available for review in the board office, regarding balancing enrollment between schools as a strategy for increasing equitable access to rigorous programs.

After reviewing feedback and consulting with numerous district departments, enrollment balancing staff has developed two options addressing enrollment issues at nine schools: Beach PK-8, Boise-Eliot/Humboldt PK-8, Chief Joseph K-5, Faubion PK-8, King PK-8, Ockley Green PK-8, Vernon PK-8, Woodlawn PK-8 and Access 1-8 Academy. The options will be released Monday afternoon, January 14, through the PPS website and regular mail.

A full staff report will be available to you late in the afternoon, January 14. Enrollment balancing staff will present the information at the board work session later that evening. As you will only have limited opportunity to review the options in advance of that work session, we is also available to return for the January 28 board meeting to answer questions and hear discussion.

Several community engagement activities have been scheduled to gather feedback on the two options. Schools will hold informational meetings January 17 through January 24, a meeting specifically for ESL families will be held on January 23 and a general community forum will be held Saturday, January 26. A complete schedule will be released January 14. To promote these meetings, staff will reach out to churches, SUN school staff, childcare providers and other community partners, informing them of the options and seeking their assistance with communication throughout the community.

Community feedback will be used to help shape the superintendent recommendation, tentatively scheduled for release by February 1. We are coordinating with board leadership to set public hearing and board discussion dates in advance of a final vote.
