#### **Supporting our Immigrant Community Members**

It is important to PPS that immigrant families feel safe and supported. A number of families have expressed to me and other members of our staff that they are concerned about possible immigration actions under the new presidential administration.

I want to reassure you that our top priority is ensuring the safety and well-being of all students and staff. We continue to work closely with PPS leadership and our community partners to uphold Oregon law prohibiting state and local law enforcement from arresting or detaining people based solely on immigration status. Additionally, Oregon law protects student educational records from use for immigration actions.

In times of uncertainty, it is always beneficial to be proactive and prepared, and it's crucial that we have up-to-date contact information for you and your student. If you have not done so already, please complete the yearly student verification form to ensure we're reaching you via the right information and in the right language.

I also wanted to provide the following resources:

## **Black History Month**

This year's <u>Black History Month</u> theme is "African Americans and Labor," and is a powerful reflection on the pivotal role that the hard work of African Americans has had in shaping our

country's history. If you are looking for ways to honor Black History Month locally, here is a <u>calendar</u> and more <u>events</u> that are going on around Portland in February.

Here at Glencoe we are intentional about including Black history in our classrooms year-round to affirm the identity of nearly 10% of our students. In curriculum at every grade level students dig into important questions such as "Whose stories are told throughout history? Whose stories are missing?" In February, particular attention is given to include different aspects of Black history in the curriculum. In second grade students are researching the biographies of influential figures in the Civil Rights Movement. In music, all classes will be working on "Lift Every Voice and Sing", the Black National Anthem. They will experience it sung by Black Amercians over the past century (since the opening of Glencoe!). The focus will be on the first verse of the song. They will also learn about many amazing Black American musicians. In PE, students are learning about the cultural and historical context of the jump rope and its ties to early African-American culture. Next time you are in the building, please come and see our display case outside of the cafeteria honoring Black History Month!


