Black History Month

This year's <u>Black History Month</u> theme is "African Americans and Labor," and is a powerful reflection on the pivotal role that the hard work of African Americans has had in shaping our country's history. If you are looking for ways to honor Black History Month locally, here is a <u>calendar</u> and more <u>events</u> that are going on around Portland in February.

At Glencoe we are intentional about including Black history and representation in the curriculum taught in our classrooms year-round to affirm the identity of nearly 10% of our student population. The display case next to the cafeteria currently houses a beautiful installment on inspirational Black figures throughout history, and includes student work from our 5th graders. Come check it out next time you are in the building!

Supporting our Immigrant Community Members

It is important to PPS that immigrant families feel safe and supported. A number of families have expressed to me and other members of our staff that they are concerned about possible immigration actions under the new presidential administration.

I want to reassure you that our top priority is ensuring the safety and well-being of all students and staff. We continue to work closely with PPS leadership and our community partners to uphold Oregon law prohibiting state and local law enforcement from arresting or detaining people based solely on immigration status. Additionally, Oregon law protects student educational records from use for immigration actions.

On the Protection of and Support for LGBTQ+ Individuals:

National PTA supports civil rights legislation, Department of Education guidance, and Department of Justice guidance that provides for the protection of all children and youth, and ensures equitable access to education, safe school environments, and affirming health care.

Black-serving organizations across the city are celebrating a "Black, Black History Month" this year by hosting a pop-up museum at The Horizon Enterprise Building in Old Town (433 NW 4th Ave.)

Old Town is one of the first neighborhoods where Black folks settled in Portland—the railroad brought families from out east in the late 1800s. It'll be a pleasure to hold space in that same neighborhood as we celebrate Black life today. This is an everyday practice in our community, but we double-down in February.

We've curated a host of galleries, events and film screenings—free and open to the public every Wednesday through Sunday this February, from 10am to 4pm.
